

Older people living in deprived areas more likely to be claiming


disability caring allowance

<u>Attendance allowance</u> is a benefit for people of state pension age with a physical disability, a mental disability (including learning difficulties) or both and who need help with caring. Attendance allowance is not means tested and is paid at two rates: a lower rate of £60 per week and £89.60 for people needing day and night support or who are terminally ill.



Areas of Oxfordshire with the highest rates of Attendance Allowance per older population were the Leys area of south east Oxford, south Bicester and parts of Banbury.
